

Italy: a disaster prone country












The Mediterranean Storms



Lesson Learnt 1/2

- Need to look for multi risks approach;
- Which focus on multifaceted impacts: physical, environmental, financial, cultural and social;
- Needs must be identified at local level;
- Strategies must be defined at central level;
- Participatory approach: involvement and commitment of all stakeholders, including private sector and general public is the "SINE QUA NON" PRECONDITION



Lesson Learnt 2/2 Theory...

- National strategies must be <u>first adapted</u>, then adopted and implemented at local level;
- Resources must come from joint efforts;
- Subsidiary principle, first horizontal and then vertical
- Comprehensive DRR activity: risks identification and mapping, citizen awareness, proper land use planning, monitoring and early warning systems, emergency response





HFA Strategy

Prime minister's decree n. 66/2008

By which the prime minister established a national platform for disaster risk reduction, entrusting the national civil protection department (IDCP) with the duty of chairing a coordination panel consisting of the various ministerial representatives in charge of defining the organizational structure of the platform and the platform charter






Prime minister's decree n. 1442/2013

By which the prime minister established defines stakeholders, their <u>roles and</u> <u>responsibilities</u> as well as the coordination mechanism

- Coordinating the Italian platform for disaster risk reduction
- Promoting cross-sectoral programmes, projects and initiatives
- Stimulating legislative innovation
- Promoting exchange of experiences at national and international levels



At local level

- •Supporting municipalities, inter-municipality organizations and provinces in developing their own risk knowledge base, forecasting and prevention systems, contingency and emergency plans.
- Promoting disaster risk training, education, awareness
- Facilitating local campaigns, events, forums

- •SUPPORT TO INSTITUTIONAL REFORMS AIMED AT ENSURING ADDITIONAL RESOURCES FOR PREVENTIVE MEASURES AND DISASTER RESPONSE AT LOCAL LEVEL.





- •NEW INITIATIVES FOR PROMOTING THE INVOLVEMENT OF REGIONS AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES IN INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS AND NETWORKS, INCLUDING THE MAKING CITIES RESILIENT CAMPAIGN;
- •MORE DIALOGUE ON DISASTER RISK PREVENTION WITH POLICYMAKERS;

- •ESTABLISHING A PLATFORM WEBSITE AND RESERVED AREA FOR EXCHANGE OF INFORMATION
- •STRENGHTENING THE INVOLVEMENT OF PRIVATE PARTNERS
- PROMOTING COOPERATION WITH FOREIGN PLATFORMS





AT LOCAL LEVEL

- FURTHER TRAINING OF MAYORS AND ADMINISTRATORS
- FACILITATING MATCHING BETWEEN NEEDS AND RESOURCES
- FURTHER REINFORCING THE ROLE PLAYED BY VOLUNTEERS
- •PROMOTING TWINNINGS AMONG CITIES, INCLUDING WITH FOREIGN PARTNERS
